The Technology Director and Assistant Technology Director attended the Model Schools meeting where the new NYSED technology plan was presented and discussed. This information was then brought back to the Technology Committee. The Technology Committee consists of the Superintendent, Director of Technology, Teacher on Special Assignment, Library Media Specialist, and Classroom Teacher. The Technology Committee met regularly to look at the NYSED goals, the school's mission statement, and our technology vision statement. The committee then looked at areas that need improvement and growth within our district and how they fit in with the NYSED goals. The committee then created three goals to address those issues and align with NYSED Technology goals.

Educators and administrators will be provided with regular, CTLE approved, professional development opportunities to assist them in providing meaningful learning opportunities for students that will enhance student learning by increasing rigor, differentiating instruction, and increasing the effective use of instructional technologies. Professional development opportunities may include training and implementation of G Suite, Schoology, and the NYS Next Generation Learning Standards. Opportunities and time will also be provided to focus on curriculum and planning.

Instructional technology goals will be measured and evaluated in various ways. An outside company will come into the district to do a network assessment to provide recommendations to improve network performance. Online surveys will also be given to teachers to determine technology use and needs in the classroom regarding interactive whiteboards and other classroom technologies. Information on the use of instructional technologies will be gathered based on past use of these technologies as a preassessment of target skills. Every five weeks, teachers will meet with instructional PD coach to review their use of instructional technologies to ensure they are meeting target goals.
